The 2011-2012 season saw baseball in WA grow in reputationand success both state and nationally, and indeed internationally with the Perth HEAT competing in the Asian Series for the first time. The respect with which we are held by other states, the ABF and the ABL can not be understated.

The season resulted in WA becoming national champions at three levels:

- Alcohol.Think Again Perth HEAT ABL National Champions with back to back wins;
- the U14's; and
- the Women's

The Board has had a productive yearwith reviews and the updating of the Constitution (to be endorsed tonight), the Governance Policy and a number of other BWA Policies. The 2012-15 Strategic Plan has been developed and

implemented, as has the 2012-13 Budget and Operational Framework.

We were successful in securing a Chevron Community Spirits Grant and a Regional Development Grant from BHP for Port Hedland and Newman. We again received terrific support from the State Government via the Department of Sport and Recreation in the continued funding for High Performance, Inclusive Services and Diamond Academy grants. Additionally we again received a significant grant from Healthways.

We currently have an application before government for substantial upgrades to our facilities and are hopeful it will receive a favourable response.

Without the above financial support from the Government of Western Australia, through the Department of Sport and Recreation, and Healthways, and the corporate sector, we would not be able provide the level of participation and achieve the successes we do in the sport of baseball in Western Australia. - Perth HEAT Colts Tour 2012 saw 40 players and 7 coaches' travel to the West coast of the USA competing in a total of 89 games against the top high school programmes and academies. 





The grand final started off with a bang, with Orlando La Rosa hitting a 3 run moonshot in the top of the 1st putting the Northern Metro's up 3-0. North continued to swing the bats in the 2nd inning when Dawson Summers hit another 3-run towering home run to left field, almost putting the game out of reach in the 2nd inning. By the 3rd inning, Yarra's pitching had been depleted and Perth Metro North put up an additional 12 runs making the score 20-1. After adding on another 9 runs in the 4th inning with another Dawson Summers home run, Perth mercied the national runner up 29-2 and still had their ace in their back pocket to finish up the final inning.

Lincoln Kempton pitched a superb 3 innings to earn the win against an offense that had swung its way past the rest of the tournament bracket. La Rosa's defensive prowess in the first few innings kept Yarra from threatening to score, and he also finished off the grand final game with a diving catch.

he 2011/12 baseball year was the most rewarding and satisfying I have experienced. It was the realisation of several years of hard work by many dedicated staff and volunteers.

Three national championships this year continues to demonstrate that BWA Player Development is the best in the country. Steve Fish has simply been magnificent in managing player development all the way from Little League to professional level. As our high performance programmes continue to mature, we can expect even more success at the national level.

The 2012 Alcohol.Think Again Perth HEAT ABL Championship was the culmination of one of the most exciting baseball seasons in recent memory. It was the

fourth National Championship for BWA and the HEAT in the past five years. There have been several key drivers to this success, beginning with Shane Tonkin, Trevor Schumm, Gordon Gerlach, Don Kyle and Brooke Knight. All have provided the organisation with management of a winning culture that is extremely difficult to develop at a national level.

Over the past two seasons Brooke Knight has taken our winning culture to a new level. His presence in WA baseball has had a far reaching effect that will continue to influence baseball in Australia for years to come.

InApril2012, it was my pleasure to attend the Baseball WA Little League State Championships. This year's tournament showed, more than ever before, fantastic depth of talent combined with a vibrant, enthusiastic participation environment for a wide ranging skill level. The development of the Little



League department has been spectacular, such that it must be a consideration for the board to shape the next evolution of BWA around Little League.

Although regional development remains a major focus for BWA and Diamond Sports in general, we continue to be significantly under resourced in this area of operations. As we enter an era where it is very likely our children will have futures in regional WA, it's in the interests of everyone in the Diamond Sports community to do all they can to help with the provision of resources and infrastructure for our game in regional WA.

I stepped down as Baseball WA Managing Director in September 2011 and, in April 2012, transitioned out of the Alcohol. Think Again Perth HEAT CEO position to become its Chairman. Both moves were necessary in order to spend more time with my family and refocus some attention on my business. Championship Series Spotlight: Brooke Knight

You adapt, you evolve, you change, or you die. That's what this league is all about."

Those are the words of Brooke Knight, manager of the 'Alcohol.Think Again' Perth HEAT. Knight, in his second year at the helm, is charged with the task this weekend of beating the Jet Couriers Melbourne Aces to earn back-to-back Australian Baseball League championships, and securing two Claxton Shields in his two years in charge.

After leading his team to a historic 34-11 regular season record and cruising into the top seed in the postseason, there are high expectations to finish the season strong. As manager, he's embracing those high expectations and using it as extra motivation to push for the top. Adapt.

"It would be silly to think that everybody within the organization wouldn't be disappointed if we didn't get the

job done," the American said, with a slight smile on his face. "It's been that kind of year, we've had that kind of run, we've had that kind of chemistry. Baseball's fickle enough where it doesn't mean we're guaranteed to close the door here, but we would surely hope to. Nobody wants to sit around for 6 months thinking about what might have been."

That kind of year, that kind of run, and that kind of chemistry has metaformidable opponent. The Melbourne Aces come into this 3-game series high after demolishing the Sydney Blue Sox in the decisive doubleheader of their Preliminary Grand Final, scoring 29 runs on the day. Knight knows that despite defeating the Victorian side in the Major Semifinal, it's going to be a completely different series. From the length of the series to the confidence their opponents will no doubt have, the HEAT manager's





mission objectives put a high significance on the opening game. Evolve.

"I think either way you really want to win game 1, which means you gotta win the first pitch," Knight said. "You just take it one at a time. It all comes out in the wash in the playoffs, and it generally will come down to one big pitch, one big swing, or one play in the field. That's just the way it goes when it's 2 out of 3, it's going to happen fast."

The fast pace won't be catching the HEAT or its skipper off guard, something that will be essential to mentally defeating your opponent. Mental strength has been just that, a strength, for the HEAT this season, and it all starts from the top. Knight is known as a fiery manager who connects with his players and isn't afraid to express his opinion, but doesn't let petty issues on the field get in the way of his ultimate goals.

"I try to just get caught up in the moment, whatever team I happen to be with," said Knight. "Try to do things the right way on the field, act like professionals, not get caught up in some of the base-level banter, and really focus on playing the game."

Having already won a championship last season, this year's squad has forced Knight to make some stylistic adjustments with lineups, pitching staffs, and the like. But in the end, he finds himself playing for the same result, a testament to his managerial abilities. Change.

"We've obviously had some changes with (James) McOwen and (Mychal) Givens and (Brenden) Webb as opposed to where (last years players Ronnie) Welty and (Robbie) Widlansky and (Cole) McCurry were last year,"

Knight noted. "But the pitching staff has really turned over a lot. We had guys like Ben Moore, (Daniel) Schmidt, and (Trevor) Caughey going last year. This year we've got a different look with Virgil (Vasquez), an experienced veteran, and Warwick Saupold, a guy who's really really improved. We've had to make a lot of adjustments on the run."

So with adjustments in hand, Knight is poised to make a run at back-to-back championships for the HEAT, cementing Perth's elite status in Australian baseball. With a mix of home grown talent and imported assistance, Knight has the tools to make it happen. And to him, the tools are what matter.

"I think if you really love to compete and do it with a group of guys you care about, achieving things as a team is where the memories are made"

Knight said. "For me, it's an additional challenge to try and go back and do it again to prove it wasn't a one-off thing. But the memories really come when you look back on who you did it with and how you went about it and I think that's the challenge. Guys on our club, they just love to compete, and if you love to compete you love to compete."

Compete they will to the end. With Knight leading the charge, stopwatch hanging from his back pocket and catcher's helmet on, failure is not an option. They've adapted, they've evolved, and they've changed. After a stellar season, the one thing they don't want to change is who takes the Claxton Shield home.

The 2012 Helms Award winner was announced Saturday night at the Baseball Australia Diamond Awards proudly presented by Virgin Australia, and yet anotheraccoladehasbeenbestoweduponamemberofthe 'Alcohol.Think Again' Perth HEAT. Tim Kennelly was in attendance to receive the honour, having fought off fierce competition from his teammate Warwick Saupold and Canberra "UberGlobal" Cavalry slugger Brian Burgamy, the other two finalists. Kennelly displayed both surprise and humility in his receipt of this prestigious award, which have been presented to Australian baseball's most outstanding player since 1962.

"[I'm] a little bit [surprised], just because the level of

competition was so good. Warwick pitched Saupold phenomenally and had a microscopic ERA this season. Saupold's success this season opened up the eyes of several professional teams and because of his impressive season got signed, and I am glad he got signed. Brian Burgamy hitting over .400 on the season (and) playing stellar baseball for 45 games, my hat's off to

these guys. Honestly, I was surprised and excited to be recognized," Kennelly said.

All three candidates brought impressive credentials in making their case for the award, but Kennelly's season certainly made him worthy of selection. He earned the team's SAM BAT Silver Slugger Award, ranking first on the team in batting average (.374) and RBI (39), along with tying Alex Burg for the team home run lead (10). His batting average and RBI total also ranked second in the league.

On 30 December, he hit two home runs in each game of a doubleheader against the Bite, setting an ABL record with four in one day. He continued his success in the Postseason, hitting .323 with eight RBI in seven games. In addition to his hitting prowess, Kennelly provided outstanding defence at both third base and in the outfield, earning a Golden Glove nomination for his efforts.

He explained: "Being an MVP is recognition for being the player that helps the team and is a leader on and off the field. For me, it was being that leader and helping my team win. It was being one of the veterans of the team and helping to prepare my teammates both physically and mentally. Leading by example with Luke [Hughes] out for the most of the season, I stepped up to lead the team, and when he was unable to play in the Championship Series, he was there in spirit and I was there providing a veteran presence and contributing to the offence."

Although the future remains uncertain regarding the Helms honouree's path to the Majors, what is certain is



that he can carry the momentum gained in his outstanding ABL campaign right in the upcoming minor league season in the Philadelphia Phillies system.

"For me personally, this season has been big; it gives me a good mindset and gives me confidence going into spring training. A lot of guys who play ball don't get the at-bats, or don't participate in a winter

league. If I get away from the game too long, then my skills become unpolished. The level of competition here is good and the at-bats are extremely helpful," Kennelly commented.



ABL Pitcher of the Year Award: Warwick Saupold




here's an old adage that reads, "what a difference a year makes." No one on the HEAT roster this season can

relate to that more than Warwick Saupold. The HEAT's beststarting pitcherthisseason and winner of this season's Australian Baseball League's Pitcher of the Year award, the Perth native has come leaps and bounds from last year.

Saupold finished last year's regular season with a 5.52 ERA, and was generally left out of manager Brooke Knight's postseason plans. This season, he cemented himself as the ace of the staff, sporting a 1.41 ERA, along with 53 strikeouts to 22 walks in 70 innings. Despite the HEAT winning it all last year, Saupold knows that a championship this season would mean a lot more to him personally.

"It'd be a dream come true, it'd be a year I'd never forget," Saupold said. "That's what we play for is a championship. Individual stuff comes and goes, but championships are forever, so I'm looking forward to this weekend."

Saupoldhasalsohadanincredibleseasonoffthediamond. In addition to having won the ABL's Pitcher of the Year



award, he was selected to pitch for Team Australia, and signed a professional baseball contract with the Detroit Tigers of Major League Baseball, an accomplishment that he attributes to his hard work and success this season.

"Mentally I got stronger from last year. I know if I had a rough inning or I gave up a couple of hits I was down in the dumps. So I just kept my head up this year and just

went about my business. I knew I had good stuff, it was just trusting it that was the big thing."

So what's made the difference from last season to this one? Many people have tabbed the fact that Saupold lost weight and got in much better shape in the offseason, and he remains a staple in the HEAT's workout room throughout the season, constantly maintaining his fitness. Two-time World Series champion and HEAT pitching coach Graeme Lloyd attributes a lot of Saupold's success to his constant will to improve physically.

"Getting in shape the way he has, he's definitely lost some weight and he came ready this year," said Lloyd. "He's got a great attitude about going out there and throwing the ball and he challenges guys."

Lloyd also knows that this newfound fitness not only shows a determination to get better, but will also translate to success on the mound for Saupold.

"He could do it before, but for 3, 4 innings

maybe. But now, he could go and he's still strong right now," said Lloyd. "His fitness has really allowed him to repeat his mechanics over and over again, and if you do that you get consistency, and that's what he's doing."


Lloyd isn't the only member of the HEAT coaching staff who has taken notice to Saupold's physical ability. Manager Brooke Knight has also noted that Saupold's work ethic may have been a deciding factor in earning him a professional contract.

"He got his body into great shape, and he really wants to play at the next level," said Knight. "Somehow, some way, he wants to get a shot, and he's very serious about it, and now he knows he's got a real chance. He's 22, but he's got a real chance based on how he's a fighter and a real physical kid."

As Saupold continues to perform day in and day out for the HEAT, and gets set for his Game 2 start in the Championship Series on Saturday, in what could be the series-clinching game, he's made his manager one happy guy.

"I'm really proud of him," Knight said of Saupold. "It's nice to see him go out there and take control and command the game. He's clearly our most improved guy and he's stepping up his game every day."

Pollowing the 'Alcohol. Think Again' Perth Heat's victory in the 2012 ConocoPhillips ABL Championship Series, Game One starting pitcher Virgil Vasquez was named Championship Series Most Valuable Player. The American right-hander from Santa Barbara, California pitched a complete game on Friday night, allowing just five hits and one run to earn the important 4-1 first-game win for his team.

After Aces catcher Kevin David launched a long home run in the second inning, tying the score at 1-1, Vasquez shut down the Melbourne attack for the remainder of the night. Just four more base hits were recorded against him, none of which came after the sixth inning. Once the victory was in sight, he turned the intensity up a level, retiring the final 11 batters in order. He notched four of his eight strikeouts in the final three frames.

The righty's control was excellent, as 92 of his 122 pitches went for strikes. He showed great stamina, as well, maintaining his velocity throughout the contest. Matched

up with Travis Blackley, another hurler with Major League Baseball experience, Vasquez came out ahead and carried his team to the series lead, which they finished off on Sunday.

The 2003 seventh round draft pick of the Detroit Tigers joined the HEAT prior to Round 10 of the regular season and fit in immediately. In his four total starts for Perth, he pitched 27.2 innings, surrendering just seven runs (2.28 ERA) and striking out 22 overall. He suffered two broken wrists in a vehicle accident in April 2010 and has been working his way back since, with this stint in the ABL showing that he is not only healthy, but ready to excel once again. Vasquez has pitched in MLB for both the Tigers and Pittsburgh Pirates and hopes to get back to that level soon.

The 2012 Under 14 WA HEAT played in the National Championships held in Perth, WA in January at the South Perth Baseball Club. We were very fortunate to have perfect weather for the 8-day event and an outstanding facility with two well-groomed and maintained diamonds that were championship caliber. I would like to thank all of the volunteers at the South Perth Club for all of their time, effort and hospitality. The Championships were definitely first class and I can't imagine there to be any better throughout the country.

TRIALS

Leading up to the tournament we had some very difficult decisions to make starting in September with nearly 60 players fighting for 16 roster spots. The competition for those roster spots was phenomenal and I couldn't have been more pleased with the effort all of the young men that gave it their all with the intentions to represent WA. The talent gap between the players trying-out was very slim which made for some difficult choices in the selection process but in the end, I think as a staff we got it right. The team was composed of players representing 10 different clubs which is a credit to the development of baseball as a whole throughout Western Australia. The baseball community (club committees, club coaches and volunteers) should be very proud of the direction this great sport is headed and the opportunities it is creating for our young players. With that being said, your hard work, dedication and passion is secondto none and I couldn't be more excited for the future and successof baseball in WA.

PRACTICE

Practices were split up between Barbagallo Ballpark and South Perth Baseball Club and held 2 nights a week prior to school holidays then 4 times a week leading up to the January tournament. It was great having access to two fantastic facilities and I would like to give special thanks to the South Perth Baseball Club and Barbagallo Ballpark for your support. As a team, the first day of practice we set some goals to achieve duringour time together. The obvious was to take home the gold but to get there we needed to be a team that was physically and mentally tougher than any other in the tournament and we all understood the grind it was going to take to get the job done. Eachandeveryplayerboughtintothisconceptchallengingeach other thru competition making each of their teammates better. If one player was having a difficult day there was always another teammate(s) to pick him up and help push him thru the day. Putting the players in pressure situations throughout practices in both simulated games and fundamental concepts gave us a huge advantage over the competition allowing us to go into the tournament with a high level of confidence knowing that once the games began the hard part was over and the easy part was about to begin.

TOURNAMENT

The WA HEAT Under 14 team finished round robin play with a 6 win and 1 loss record before heading into a Gold Medal game against a strong Victoria Blue team that had handed the WA HEAT its only loss of the tournament. That loss came on the final day of round robin play and essentially meant nothing knowing that both teams were going to meet again the following day in the Championship match. However, that game was very pivotal in our guest for gold. It gave us a chance to rest some players and for some others to see how they matched up against such a powerful team that had outscored opponents 116 to 36 prior to our game. Vic Blue chose not to rest there stronger players and was out to win the game securing home field advantage in the final. We lost the game 14 to 16 on a walk off home run in the bottom of the 7th inning but our high level of confidence remained, in fact it grew and there was NO WAY we were going to be denied in the gold medal game. The day of the Gold Medal game we were listed as the visiting team but with nearly 1000 fans in attendance the home field advantage shifted to our favorand the atmosphere was incredible which our kids thrived on. Eight of our nine starters recorded at least one hit a piece and leading the way was Jake Turnbull who finished the game with 3 hits and 4 RBI's the biggest hit coming in the 5th inning with a bases loaded clearing triple that put us up 12-5 and the game out of reach. Josh Diggins with nearly a tournament best .700 batting average was in the leadoff spot and reached base safely 5 times going 2 for 2 (3 BB) and scoring 3 runs. Jess Williams contributed with 2 RBI's while Jordan Power, Mitchell Brown and Alex Hall each had a 1 RBI as well. Jake Baker who had picked up 2 wins earlier in the tournament started the game on the mound and was outstanding once again pitching 4 2/3 innings while allowing only 3 earned runs to pick up the win for the 2012 National Champion WA HEAT. It was a total TEAM effortall the way through the tournament and I couldn't be more proud of these players or think of any more deserving than this group. It was a privilege and honor to work with each and every one of them and something I will never forget.

BUDGET

UNIFORMS

The uniforms were a continuation of the uniforms from last year. As the team was made up of mainly new players, the team needed to be sized and ordered in time for Cap Night.

A problem has occurred over the last couple of years where players have been injured at the last minute and replacement uniforms have to be found. As the supplier closes mid December, this eliminates any possibility of late replacements. EOUIPMENT

main place we visited was Franklins Tavern who supplied more than adequate meals for the team. Thank you to Chris Dodd and Franklins Tavern who are huge supporters of baseball in WA. Costs for all breakfast and lunches were included in the ABF Levy.

GROUND TRANSPORT

As we were the home team the need for a third bus to pick up casesetc, was not required. The team went with 2x12 seater buses and the coaches used my car for any extra transport required.

CAP NIGHT

Cap night was held at Barbagallo Ballpark with parents supplying supper and soft drinks available for purchase. As most teams had training before Cap Night, Baseball WA provided hot chicken rolls for the players before the night officially began. Thanks to Lachy Dale, Steve Fish, Brooke Knight, Graeme Lloyd and Allan de San Miguel for their help. The night was made more interesting as the heavens opened up and the night ended in a total drenching. This evening continues to be significant in the recognition of our youth players and must be continued as an official function.

VFNUF

RECOMMENDATIONS

This would therefore follow that the teams find their own breakfasts but stay with the lunches at the Tournament venue. The late release of information can be eliminated by reducing

the amount of workload that the ABF carry. Accommodation is a perfect way to do this. If this was returned to the States to look after, then most States will have full knowledge of their accommodation and can organised accordingly. This would be done as soon as the next venue is announced.

Every year we have the same problems and every year we hope that they have been fixed.

UNIFORM — Retain format of uniforms but would suggest removing the name from the back of the uniform to eliminate the problem of late replacement uniforms or make sure that we have extra uniforms in stock as replacement uniforms.

UMPIRES AND SCORERS — A recommendation would be that the ABF source sponsors to cover the costs of umpires and scorers. At the moment this is covered by the players with small donations from the Scorers and Umpires Associations.

Coaches Report

TRIALS AND PREPARATION

The try outs began in September at Barbagallo Ballpark, with approximately 55 players attending. After 4 weeks of tryouts the squad of 21 players was announced.

TEAM PRACTICE

Practice was split between Baseball Park and Forster Park. On Monday nights we trained with the U/18's which I found to be a double-edged sword. Although it was fantastic to have Mark

Pettit and the U/18's staff assisting, for some reason our U/16 players became timid in the presence of the older guys.

On Wednesday nights we trained at Forster Park, we played a lot of intra-squad games and did the bulk of our pitching and defensive work.

On Saturday mornings we had BP sessions at Baseball Park.

COACHING STAFF

I was joined in the coaching staff by Chris King and Steve O'Connor, both of which were my assistants for the 2011 U/14's. Unfortunately both guys had to miss a number of training



sessions during our preparation, as Chris was busy opening his own business and Steve having to travel interstate at various times with his work. Despite this, both guys were a great help and were very passionate about the success of the team.

During the tournament Steve and Chris were fantastic support and tireless workers. We spent many hours dotting our I's and crossing our T's trying to come up with ways to change the team's fortunes. One of the changes we did was to have Steve - normally our pitching coach – coach first base, with Chris moving from to coach third base. This allowed me to stay in the dugout to discuss situations and at-bats with our hitters and also to try to keep our guys focussed on the game. Judith Dutton was our EO and, having not met Judith before, she quickly lived up to all of the great things I had heard about her. I can't thank her enough for her tireless efforts, great sense of humour and wisdom.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The National Championships were held in Geelong in from the 7th to the 18th of January. We stayed at Geelong Grammar School in terrific accommodation. I cannot fault the housing arrangements at all, except to say that perhaps the beds were a little thin and the crickets outside my window were too loud. But apart from that, the facilities were fantastic.

As far as the baseball tournament itself, the best I can offer is that it was very disappointing. Unfortunately we lost our captain

Sam Kennelly 4 weeks prior to the tournament, which was a huge loss. As Sam is such a special talent, we knew it would be hard to replace his bat, defence at shortstop and his pitching. But still, I was confident that with the spread of talent we had, we could share the load and still give a great account of our selves. I was also hopeful that out of the disappointment an opportunity would open up for some other guys to grow and lead the team. Unfortunately, it didn't really eventuate. Although the guys cannot be questioned for the effort they put in, at important times during our games it was clear that we lacked the confidence and leadership we needed to get us over the line. We would end up finishing 6th in the tournament with a 6 & 6 record.

As Head Coach it was a very frustrating tournament. I was very disappointed with where we finished as I felt we had a genuine chance to win every game we played. But we just could not seem to get everything clicking. When we hit well, we fielded poorly, when we fielded and hit will, we walked too many hitters. It just never came together when we needed it. I could see that we had the talent and potential to beat every team we played, but unfortunately as a team, the players lacked the belief, the confidence and ultimately, the courage to win.

The standout player in our team was Robert Herzfeld (Croc), who won our MVP Award. Croc had a fantastic tournament and was deservingly named as the Centre fielder of the All-starteam. It was a pleasure to coach such a great kid. It will be exciting to watch his great future unfold.

I would also like to mention that Callan Silvi stepped in as a replacement for Samandwenton to have a fantastic tournament, highlighted by a 6 inning 1-hit performance against Vic White.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Coaching Staff: I definitely think that WA State teams should have 4 coaches. We definitely found ourselves shorthanded and a 4th coach would have been a great asset. I also think that given the personnel availability, it would be a great help to have a more senior coach on staff.

Preparation: In theory the concept of having roving instructors was a great one. But, I can honestly say that we had access to them maybe 3 times maximum. And to be honest, I'm not sure they were really that helpful anyway. If we are going to have rovers then a) I think they should actually be there, b) be there for a specific reason and c) fit into the teams' plans, so we don't have to fit our preparation into rovers' availability. In the end I had Evan Porter come to our Wednesday sessions at Forster Park to help with our defence. In 2011, with the U/14's we had Lachlan Dale as our hitting instructor and he came when we asked him and fit into our plans, rather than the other way around. In my opinion this worked much better.

I would like to thank all the players and their parents for their efforts over the months. Unfortunately the results on the field weren't there, but I am still proud of the guys for the way they carried themselves at all times. They were a fun bunch to be around and I will have a keen interest in their development throughout the years.

I'd like to thank Mark Pettit, Shane Spry and Dean Burton for their help and support, being on hand to share in your great tournament was a highlight.

Thanks to Carol Williams for her hours of work in getting the guys ready to get back on the field. Carol was a terrific help. Thanks also to Rod Drew for your never-ending support and advice, it's greatly appreciated.

Congratulations to Chris Eckley and the U/14's on their gold medal. It was a great effort, a much deserved victory.

Finally I would like to thank Steve Fish, Andrew Todd and the BWA board for the opportunity to coach the 2012 State U16's, it was a great experience and one that I have learned a lot from. Kind Regards,

Sports Trainer's Report

PRE-TOURNAMENT PHASE:

Sports Trainer in attendance at ALL training sessions for pregame and rehab sessions not utilised by 16's for this.

Very little work was done with the under 16's pre tournament until the last two weeks before travel.

ALL pitchers had there pitching arm regularly compressed and iced after throwing an innings in a game situation.

ALL pitchers and catchers were asked to buy "compression socks" and to start using them after any type of throwing activity pre-tournament as a rehab aide.

TOURNAMENT PHASE:

Sports Trainer in attendance for ALL games and recovery period.

ALL pitchers received ice and compression after throwing in

a game. (No limit on number of pitches thrown all needed treatment as they were in tournament phase ... i.e. work done in bull pen could equate to a game number of pitches thrown).

Catchers were iced down on the majority of occasions

On day after catching ... the catches in the second week were getting massages on the shoulder and elbow area of throwing arm ... mostly for "loosening up" prior to warm up. This seemed to work well as all catchers were able to back up daily if and when needed.

If pitchers had a days rest they all received a light relaxation therapy massage to their pitching arm/elbow/shoulder. ALL responded well to this. Regular queues were evident prior to warm up!!

No major leg problems at all in the 16's ... no treatment completed on this body area all tournament.

A large number of grass burns occurred over the fortnight ... these were patched for the game quickly and then treated after the game. Treatment consisted of: cleaning the wound with water and Dettol with gauze, wiping over with Betadine and then applying Fixomul dressing to the site (this was to stay on until the dressing fell off). For play the dressing was covered with an Adhesive bandage and then removed after play. If the wound cover was dirty the site was redressed and cleaned. No infections developed overthefortnight and all sites healed well "in Tournament".

In the dug out there was a STRICT water only policy as a number of players had the potential to have "powerade / gaterade" overkill.

A" blanket ban" was put on all Protein shakes and drinks, pills and bars after lengthy consultation with the AIS nutritionist and ASADA who were in the process of testing all protein supplements as some contained substances that were not listed on the tins.

A couple of players had regular strapping to their wrist for the length of the tournament. Injuries received day one.

GENERAL COMMENTS:

All players who are seeing a Physiotherapist or chiropractor prior to the tournament need to get a letter from them outlining the problem and the treatment necessary for them to "survive" a two week tournament. This will assist the trainer in their rehabilitation after games and the warm necessary for them prior to games.

The large majority of parents were very supportive of all treatments and things implemented over the tournament on the medical side for the boys.

ALL boys were very dedicated to their rehab with me and were always polite and well mannered on all occasions during treatment.

TRIALS

Trials again started in October (School Holidays). This year we had an increase from 27 last year to 39 try out. The timeline was tight for team selection but this is bound by uniform issues. Centralising trials at Baseball Park was once again invaluable as well as having the services of Steve Fish and Rod Drew.

PRACTICE

- Accessto Barbagallo Ballpark. The fact that we were allowed on Baseball Park 2 nights a week was a real positive. The fields we played on in Geelong were of the same design however I feel that Baseball Park's surface is firmer and plays better. No reflection on the world class facilities at Geelong but to have Baseball Park as a training venue is a bonus. Even to use the cages and the bull pens is a bonus.
- 2. TrainingwiththeUnder16s.Itwasextremelyvaluabletojoin in with the 16sthis year when we had the opportunity from bothaplayer's and coach's perspective. The players obviously benefited as it meant running match simulations was a lot easier as players could be in their allocated positions and not "making up the numbers". Although we did not train together a great deal I felt that the scrimmages that we were able to run were of great importance to our development. The combination of practices on several occasions allowed the extension of the Diamond Academy programme as the bulk of the Under 16 and Under 18 teams came from this programme. This meant that the Under 16 team were certainly not intimidated by the Under 18 team and this allowed us to keep our teams together when scrimmaging.
- 3. Goodwill Series. Unfortunately this did not go ahead again this year as it has in the past and I believe detracted from our preparation. Last year Rod Drew organised a large number of players who had returned from college for Christmas to scrimmage against the U/18 team. This experience was invaluable and I think it provided almost a showcase of the best talent in WA under the age of about 21. Steve Fish arranged a couple of games this year however due to some communication breakdowns (not due to Steve's effort) with the players we were unable to have the same impact with these games.

TOURNAMENT

Iamimmensely proud of the way that the Under 18 srepresented Baseball in WA. They played as hard as they could each day and

for a number of players I hope it inspires them onto greater things in the sport. The pitchers were a wonderful bunch of young men who battled through some adversity but once we arrived in Geelong they assured me they were ready to go and neveroncemadethemselvesunavailablethroughinjury. That is a credit to their mental as well as physical application.

Although the stats will show we finished third, to finish the round robin in 4th place and then finish on top after the first play off round showed how the team improved as we played more togetherbutalsotheirdesiretomakesurewegaveeverythingwe had. Although as a playing group we believed that we had a real chance to win it, we know that some people did not have high hopes for us. We hoped that by representing Baseball WA in the manner we did we may have changed their perception of this outstanding group of young men.

A special congratulations to Josh Kennelly, Nic Stanbury and Jarrod Zarahdnik who were joint MVPs. As a coaching staff we could not split these 3 young men and the contribution they made to the success of the team.

COACHING STAFF

Dean Burton as an Assistant Coach was once again invaluable. His knowledge of the game and his ability to lead and instruct should never be underestimated by this organisation. Due to Shane being restricted with work time Dean's input was critical to our success. He develops a wonderful rapport with the players and his knowledge of the game and the way he imparts this improves every year. He is an asset to the programme.

Shane Spry this year was a dedicated coach to the Under 18 programme. After moving as a roving coach last year to have him in the Under 18 programme was a bonus. Shane's ability to discuss issues with the hitters and his experience in professional baseball allowed a great deal of flexibility in the coaching staff and he also took on the role of discussing matters with the pitchers when required. To have someone of Shane's experience backinvolved in our programme gives it great credibility and has rejuvenated it as well.

HEAT Coaches. We were fortunate this year to have the input from a number of HEAT players into our training sessions. These included Alex Burg, James McOwen, Brenden Webb, Luke Hughes, Allan de San Miguel, Matt and Tim Kennelly as well as Head Coach Brooke Knight and Pitching Coach Graeme Lloyd. Any input we received from them was always welcome and appreciated.

Steve Fish in his role as the Player Development Manager was also very accessible. Spread across 3 State teams as well as the Alcohol. Think Again Alcohol. Think Again Perth HEAT Assistant Coach he had a very busy summer but his thoughts and input were often sought and always appreciated.

Dea Saupold did an outstanding job as Executive Officer. She ensured that off the field there was never any stone left unturned so our players were ready to play. Dea has a great rapport with the parent group and she was always prepared to keep them

informed of any changes that may have occurred. She was also a wonderful link person with Baseball WA, Annie (our Alcohol. Think Again Perth HEAT Physio) and our hotel. She does a wonderful job and is a great asset to Baseball WA and the Youth Programme.

Once again we were fortunate enough to have the services of Carol Williams. She spent more hours at the ballpark coordinating the injury management and rehab of both the 16s and the 18s. She also worked tirelessly at the hotel to ensure our players were fit and ready to go. We can never underestimate the importance of Carol. I would think that Carol should be a key component of any State team that travels as her baseball specific knowledge ensures that the treatment the players receive is precise and delivered effectively and efficiently to gain maximum results. Our soft tissue injuries are never major factors in our tournaments as thanks to her.

I must also thank BWA for once again allowing me the honour of being involved in their programs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Given the current economic climate, I am unsure as to the future of the Goodwill Series. I would like to propose that the U/18s look at playing once a week as a group. There are a few ways that we could do this but I think if we played against each club's AAA team it could work. The idea that if the AAA team wins then they get points to count to the end of the year. The AAA team could use anyone within their club to play and that the rules regarding imports and their pitching eligibility not be enforced for these fixtures. This could be played as part of a double header on a night where a State League club had a fixture. I would welcome any discussion on this topic.
- I still maintain that 4 Coaches, an EO and soft tissue specialist is the required coaching staff for a tournament of thisduration and especially when dealing with this age group and below due to the supervision and duty of care issues. Having Steve Fish on the staff for one game in Geelong was a huge bonus and helped immensely.
- State teams still need to have access to Baseball Park to train on a regular basis. This is a vital component to the success of the programme and gives it great credibility.

Sports Trainer's Report

PRE-TOURNAMENT PHASE:

Sports Trainer in attendance at ALL training sessions for pregame and rehab sessions not utilised by 16's for this.

Very little work was done with the under 16's pre tournament until the last two weeks before travel.

ALL pitchers had there pitching arm regularly compressed and iced after throwing an innings in a game situation.

ALL pitchers and catchers were asked to buy "compression socks" and to start using them after any type of throwing activity pre-tournament as a rehab aide.

TOURNAMENT PHASE:

Sports Trainer in attendance for ALL games and recovery period.

ALL pitchers received ice and compression after throwing in a game. (No limit on number of pitches thrown all needed treatment as they were in tournament phase ... i.e. work done in bull pen could equate to a game number of pitches thrown). Catchers were iced down on the majority of occasions

On day after catching ... the catches in the second week were getting massages on the shoulder and elbow area of throwing arm ... mostly for "loosening up" prior to warm up. This seemed to work well as all catchers were able to back up daily if and when needed.

Ifpitchershadadaysresttheyallreceivedalightrelaxationtherapy massagetotheirpitchingarm/elbow/shoulder.ALLresponded well to this. Regular queues were evident prior to warm up!! No major leg problems at all in the 16's ... no treatment completed on this body area all tournament.

A large number of grass burns occurred over the fortnight ... these were patched for the game quickly and then treated after the game. Treatment consisted of: cleaning the wound with water and Dettol with gauze, wiping over with Betadine and then applying Fixomul dressing to the site (this was to stay on until the dressing fell off). For play the dressing was covered with an Adhesive bandage and then removed after play. If the wound cover was dirty the site was redressed and cleaned. No infections developed over the fortnight and all sites healed well "in Tournament".

In the dug out there was a STRICT water only policy as a number of players had the potential to have "powerade / gaterade" overkill.

A" blanket ban" was put on all Protein shakes and drinks, pills and bars after lengthy consultation with the AIS nutritionist and ASADA who were in the process of testing all protein

supplements as some contained substances that were not listed on the tins.

A couple of players had regular strapping to their wrist for the length of the tournament. Injuries received day one.

GENERAL COMMENTS:

All players who are seeing a Physiotherapist or chiropractor prior to the tournament need to get a letter from them outlining the problem and the treatment necessary for them to "survive" a two week tournament. This will assist the trainer

in their rehabilitation after games and the warm necessary for them prior to games.

The large majority of parents were very supportive of all treatments and things implemented over the tournament on the medical side for the boys.

ALL boys were very dedicated to their rehab with me and were always polite and well mannered on all occasions during treatment.

The 2012 Womens Baseball Nationals were held in Canberra in April. After finishing a disappointing 4th last year we were all determined to improve on that performance and bring the title back to WA, that we did!

We had an excellent turn out to tryouts this year, having to make3separatecuts before eventually selecting the final squad of 16. The depth of this year's team was second to none, and adding some experience this year was a huge key in our success.

We started the tournament off big with a 15 run 1st inning against Northern Territory, eventually beating them 16-2. We continued on pace with a 18-0 victory over ACT and a 14-5 victory over Queensland to move to 3-0. This is the position we wanted to be in. The way I saw it, it didn't matter if we finished 1st or 4th, our goal as a team and coaching staff was to make it to the playoffs with our top 5 pitchers ready to go, and we did just that. We took a tough loss against Victoria Blue 11-1 in game 4 but that did not discourage the girls one bit. We stuck to our game plan and beat Country NSW 15-6 to assure us a spot in the top 4 and a semi final birth. The final game of the round robin did not mean much as far as standings went but confidence was a big thing heading into the playoffs and we walked away from a 24-23 loss with our heads held high.

The stage was set for a semi final show down against the defending champs Victoria Blue. We sent Natalie Rawlings to the mound that game to get us a spot in the gold medal game. Natalie's confidence and fearlessness was exactly what we needed from our pitcher that day and she delivered one of the best pitching performances I have ever seen as a coach or player. This was the game the team really came together and it was amazing to watch. Sue White made a few unbelievable catches from left field that no doubt helped us win that game. RebeccaCrosbydeliveredoneofthebestcatchingperformance I have seen in some time as well. We went on to win the semi final game 3-0 in a total team effort. We played for gold the following day.

There's nothing in sport more exciting then the championship game, and finally after months and months of training the day was upon us! We sent Jacinda Barclay to the mound that game in what was a very easy decision for the coaching staff. Despite a shaky first outing against Vic Blue, Jacinda's confidence on the hill as well as her national and international experience let us know she was the one for the job. In what was a very back and forth game, the NSW team took an early 2-0 lead. However it was only a matter of time before the best bats in

the tournament got going. We put up 4 runs in the 3rd inning to take the lead only to give up 2 runs in the bottom half to put us in a tie. We scored 2 runs in the following 2 innings to take an 8-5 lead into the bottom of the sixth. NSW battled tough and knocked Jacinda out of the game with a 3 run sixth inning to tie the game going into the last inning. Natalie Rawlings who was our most consistent hitter all tournament, delivered yet again to lead off the inning with a single. Christina Kreppold then delivered the biggest hit of the tournament for us doubling in Nat Rawlings for what turned out to be the game winning run. Kreppold then came into shut down NSW in the bottom of the inning for a 1,2,3 final inning giving us the gold medal!

I would like to say how proud I am of this very special group of girls who never quit and stuck with the game plan from day 1. Every girl on this team played a major role in our gold medal victory and each and every one of them should be extremely proud of what they accomplished.

I would also like to thank my amazing coaching staff. Amanda Mirco is a legend in Women's baseball here in WA and after a great playing careers he sure starting her coaching career off on a good note. I/we could not have done it without Mircs, there was never anything too hard or too much to ask of her. She did everything with a smile on her face and for the betterment of womens baseball, thanks a million Mircs!

Frankie Chong is another person we could not have done this without. His eagerness is like a child on the baseball field which you don't see too much of these days. A grown man with a passion for baseball that cant help but put a smile on your face. He did everything we needed him to do and kept the girls loose and having fun which is a big reason we won. Our team not only worked the hardest but we also had the most fun, which makes me happy to say.

We would also like to thank Daniel Schmidt our pitching coach. Without Schmidty our pitching staff would not have been nearly as effective. BUDGET

With a few sponsorships from a family, Mirco Brothers and an organised team quiz night, a sum of money was deducted off the final player total of \$2050.

UNIFORMS

A few new players needed to organise player tops which needed to match the old ones, this took a little longer than expected due to suppliers but managed to have them to the girls two days prior to departure. All other items purchased were ordered from Fielder's Choice and delivered to players efficiently two weeks prior to departure. A total of \$1960 was spent on uniform purchases.

ACCOMMODATION AND TRAVEL

Air travel was organised in the ABF participation agreement. This year we were allowed to organise our own accommodation. We stayed at Parkland's Apartment in Dickson, ACT. The team was very impressed with the room layouts, space and access to bathrooms, kitchen, laundry, pool and walking distance to local shops. We had 4×2 bedroom interconnecting rooms with 5 singles beds in each. Accommodation for ten nights came to a total of \$12,960, a total of \$810 each for players.

GROUND TRANSPORT

This year ground transport was included in the ABF agreement. They organised 2x12 seater vans and one tonne van for luggage. No complaints.

VENUE

Narrabundah Ballpark once again proved to be an excellent ground facility, and the ground staff kept the Championship running smoothly at a very high standard. ABF were responsible for provision of lunch to players, scoring facilities, programs, and merchandising. Cassandra Sedgman Tournament Director ensured all teams were kept informed of events, and game time changes.

Programmes were available to players mid week.

WA MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AWARD

For an outstanding performance at the National Women's Championships, Natalie Rawlings was not only awarded WA MVP but Golden Glove and Most Valuable Player of the tournament and a position in the All Star Team.

FINAL STANDING

After six games against each state we managed to finish third only losing two games to Victoria and NSW. On the 13th of April Western Australia played Victoria in the Semi Final winning 3-0. On the 14th April Western Australia played NSW in the Grand Final.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements cover Baseball WA Limited as an individual entity. Baseball WA Limited is a company limited by shares, incorporated and domicited in Australia.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including Australian Accounting Interpretations) of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Corporations Act 2001.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AAS8 has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards as issued by the IAS8. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The financial statements were authorised for issue on by the directors of the company.

Accounting Policies

Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of properly, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment lesses.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment.

In the event the carrying value of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

The cost of fixed assets constructed within the company includes the cost of materials, direct labour, borrowing costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of comprehensive income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of properly, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the company. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

The essets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of the reporting period.

An assets carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the assets carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

Financial Instruments

Initial Recognition and Measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the company commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting adopted).

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified 'at fair value through profit or less', in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or less immediately.

Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the company essesses whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. The assessment will include considering external and internal sources of information. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or less unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment less of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

Impairment testing is performed annually for goodwill and intangible assets with indefinite lives.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's fability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees at the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash outflows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected firning of cash flows.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outlow of economic benefits will result and that outlow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial essets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of liability.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2012

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the æset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST components of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.
